Excavation Starts in Bucharest M6 Metro Project

News in Brief

Excavation of the tunnel between 1 Mai - Tokyo Stations as part of the Bucharest M6 Metro

Project, Lot 1.1, was successfully started with TBM (St. Maria) as of 9 April 2025. While 32% physical progress has been achieved throughout the project thus far, work on stations and shaft areas continues at an intense pace. Tunnel segment production, a critical component of tunnel construction, is at 48% completion and is progressing in accordance with the targeted program. Efficiency in production processes is paramount to ensure uninterrupted continuity of segment assemblies following TBM (Tunnel Boring Machine) excavation operations.

At the special ceremony attended by Romanian Prime Minister Ion Marcel Ciolacu, Minister of Transport Infrastructure Sorin Mihai Grindeanu, Japanese Ambassador Takashi Katae, Turkish Ambassador Özgür Kıvanç Altan, Metrorex General Manager Mariana Miclăuș, Alarko Holding Chairman İzzet Garih, Makyol Chairman Adnan Çebi, Alarko Contracting Group General Manager Ümit Boran, JICA representatives, representatives of the Construction Supervisor company, and project team members, the project phases were reviewed and a strong message of commitment was conveyed towards achieving the set targets.

Izzet Garih. Chairman of the Board of Directors of Alarko Holding, made the following remarks in his speech at the ceremony: "Today, we are gathered to celebrate the milestone between 1 Mai and Tokyo on the Southern Section of the M6 line. At Alarko, we are committed to enhancing mobility and improving the urban environment by investing in Romania's metro infrastructure. We are proud to contribute to improved mobility and a cleaner urban environment by investing in Romania's metro infrastructure. In addition to our tunnel construction efforts, we are taking a significant stride towards our objective of developing sustainable cities. I would like to sincerely thank all our stakeholders who contributed to the commissioning of our Tunnel Boring Machines (TBMs), marking a critical milestone in the project, as well as our dedicated team whose efforts have been instrumental in bringing this vision to life."







TSKB and Alarko Agriculture Sign 80 Million Euro Loan Agreement for **Geothermal Modern Greenhouse Investment**

The Industrial Development Bank of Türkiye (TSKB) and Alarko Agriculture Group have signed an €80 million loan agreement to finance Türkiye's largest modern greenhouse project, which will be implemented in Eskisehir. Alarko Agriculture Group's affiliate Nata Agriculture will be investing in a technologically advanced greenhouse that will use geothermal energy on an area of 850 decares. The project will be the first in Türkiye's agricultural sector to be financed by the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD). It will be financed with a loan with a total maturity of 12 years, with a 2-year grace period. The project aims to increase access to sustainable food and is expected to create employment for more than 800 people, 75 percent of whom will be women. It will stand out with its environmentalist approaches such as the efficient use of water resources. Ümit N. Yıldız.

CEO of Alarko Group of Companies, stated that the loan gareement signed with TSKB. Türkive's leading institution in sustainable banking, will significantly contribute to Alarko Agriculture Group's goal of ranking among the world's top 10 in geothermal greenhouses within five years. He added. "Our investments in modern greenhouses are the driving force behind our 360-degree agricultural vision. Alarko Agriculture Group is now among Türkiye's leading modern greenhouse operators with investments in Afyonkarahisar, Denizli, and Eskişehir. The planned investment in Eskişehir represents Türkiye's largest modern greenhouse project and is poised to be a prime example of sustainable agriculture." Yıldız added that this financing provided through TSKB's support reflects Alarko's contribution to local development and the confidence in Alarko's role as a responsible investor.

İzzet Garih Shares Alarko's Equality Vision at the #Womenandmenareequalperiod Conference

Izzet Garih, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Alarko Holding, participated as a speaker at the #WomenAndMenAreEqualPeriod



Conference, one of the key events highlighting the issue of gender equality, organized for the fifth time this year by the Yanındayız Association, İzzet Garih hiahliahted his belief in women's intuition and meticulousness. underscoring the significance of their role in accounting and auditing positions within Alarko Holding. Garih expressed his belief in the added value created by these qualities of women, stating that the Holding's female employee ratio stands at 56%, with a notable increase in the number of female employees in the financial affairs and accounting departments. Garih shared that Alarko Holding's Board of Directors is currently comprised of 33% women, and emphasized the commitment to increasing this figure to 50% by 2031.

Ümit N. Yıldız Shares Alarko's **Sustainability Strategies at UEZ 2025**

The "International Economic Summit" (UEZ 2025), which brought together leading figures from Turkish and global politics, business, and academia, was held on 17-20 April under the theme "Changing Global Realities and Future 5.0". During the event, which Alarko sponsored, critical topics were discussed in depth, including new investment opportunities, export strategies, political and economic transformation processes. the role of innovation in financial technologies, and the green economy. One of the standout sessions of the summit was the "Green Economy and the Future of Sustainability" panel, held on Saturday, 19 April, featuring Ümit N. Yıldız, CEO of Alarko Group of Companies, as a speaker.

In his speech, Ümit N. Yıldız, CEO of Alarko Group of Companies, shared Alarko's sustainability strategies and future vision, stating: "As we transform our Group into a global portfolio

Türkiye's Largest Single-Roof Greenhouse Opens in Afvonkarahisar

Alarko Agriculture Group inaugurated Türkiye's largest modern geothermal greenhouse, built under a single roof by its affiliate Alsera, which specializes in greenhouse production. Speaking at the opening ceremony, Ümit N. Yıldız, CEO of Alarko Group of Companies, stated: "We remain steadfast in our investments that foster economic and social development in agriculture, a sector we have identified as strategic. Over the past two years, we have invested approximately \$300 million in agriculture, aiming for a comprehensive presence; from greenhouse cultivation and niche fertilizers to seed breeding and the food industry. By the end of 2024, we had become Türkiye's largest modern greenhouse investor, with

operations spanning over 1,200 decares. Today, we are proud to unveil the largest single-roof greenhouse in the country. Becoming one of the ten largest modern greenhouse operators in the world is among our priorities."

The modern greenhouse in Afvonkarahisar's central district ranks among the largest geothermally heated greenhouses in both Türkiye and Europe, boasting a net indoor area of 180 decares. Under the Agriculture Group, Alsera, operating in Afvonkarahisar, Denizli, and Eskisehir, has increased its total number of modern greenhouses to twenty with this inauguration.

The Dried Food **Factory of Alarko Food Industry Has Started Production**

Alarko Food Industry, operating in the field of dried food products under the Alarko Agriculture Group, has established its new factory in the Konya Ereğli Organized Industrial Zone. With its new factory featuring an annual raw material processing capacity of 7,500 tons and an indoor area of 12.000 m². Alarko Food has increased its production capacity in the dried food sector by 300 percent.



The company offers value-added solutions from natural and healthy agricultural products and carries out production using the REV system, one of the world's most innovative technologies in fruit and vegetable drying. Alarko Gida presents dried forms of 14 fruit and 31 vegetable varieties to meet diverse

Innovative MEDAŞ Solution Boosts Speed and Efficiency in Field Operations

MEDAŞ speeds up field work with an innovative solution for transformer fixture rod failures. In field operations, rod failures frequently involved bolts becoming welded to the rod due to arcing, making conventional repair methods inadequate. In such cases, the defective rod had to be cut, and if it was too short, the transformer's top cover had to be removed to install a new rod. This resulted in significant time loss and high costs due to transformer repair and replacement operations.

Thanks to a special apparatus developed by MEDAŞ for field use, direct installation can be performed on the rod cut at the defective point, regardless of its length. This method significantly reduces intervention time by eliminating the need for transformer replacement, allowing the transformer to be quickly put back into operation. This prevents extended outages, improves average outage duration metrics, and reduces potential consumer complaints. MEDAŞ's solution-oriented approach aims to deliver more sustainable and uninterrupted energy service to consumers by reducing costs and enhancing efficiency in operational processes.



Alarko Holding hosted the Türkiye Corporate Governance Association's (TKYD) "ESG Reporting Standards Practical Workshop," bringing together industry stakeholders at its headquarters. The next-generation entrepreneurship has embraced an identity that places innovation at its core, leverages technology effectively, and adopts a global mindset. Now, the primary objective within the entrepreneurship ecosystem is rapid growth and becoming a global player.

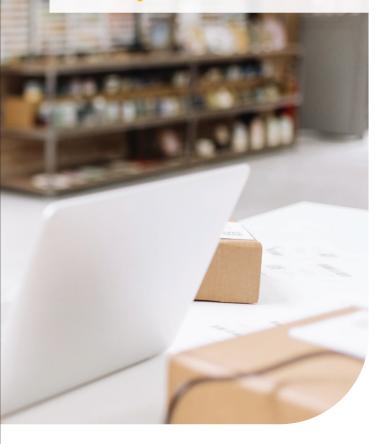

Technology the Driving Force

Airbnb stands out as one of the most striking examples of next-generation entrepreneurship on a global scale. Founded in 2008, the company drew global attention with an IPO valuation exceeding \$100 billion in just 12 years. We can also observe this characteristic of rapid growth and innovation orientation in overall market data: Back in 2013, there were only a few dozen socalled 'unicorns', i.e. companies valued at over \$1 billion. By 2023, this number had surged to 1,229. This data alone highlights the rapid acceleration and scaling of the entrepreneurial landscape.

Naturally, the driving force behind this growth is technology. Advancements in digital infrastructure, reduced technology costs, and easier access to technological tools have significantly lowered barriers to entry. Take cloud computing, for instance: launching a startup was far costlier two decades ago, today it's possible to deliver services worldwide via subscription-based models, with minimal upfront tech investment In other words, factors like capital, labor, experience, and technical expertise have taken a back seat, while the idea itself, the drive to create value, and strategic positioning have moved to the forefront.



Four Main Pillars

As the entrepreneurship ecosystem transforms. four main pillars—digitalization, sustainability. social impact, and inclusiveness—have come to the forefront, with next-generation entrepreneurs increasingly defining themselves through these values.

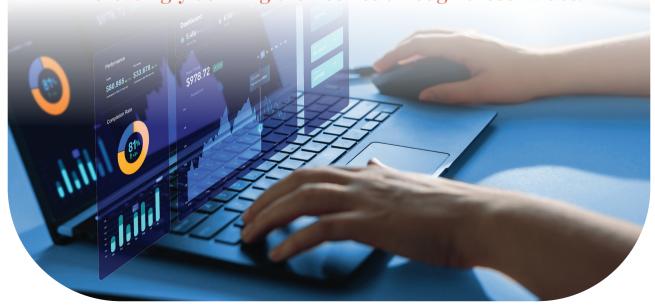
The most prominent among these pillars is undoubtedly digitalization. The fact that 67% of the world's population was online by 2023 underscores this reality. Today, two-thirds of the world's population represents an enormous market potential for entrepreneurs offering digital services. The global retail e-commerce volume reaching 5.8 trillion dollars in 2023 is a direct outcome of this vast potential. A product crafted in a small workshop can now reach customers anywhere in the world through e-commerce platforms. In addition, emerging digital technologies such as artificial intelligence, the Internet of Things (IoT), and blockchain have paved the way for entirely new business models.

Sustainability, Social Impact, and Inclusion

As mentioned earlier, sustainability has been one of the key pillars supporting the rise of the nextgeneration entrepreneurship ecosystem. Ventures that adopt a holistic approach, and put thinking and acting with a focus on the planet at the core of their business models, have stood out. Startups focusing on areas such as waste management, upcycling, recycling, clean energy, and carbon capture have gained particular prominence. These efforts not only generate profitable sectors but also carry the vital mission of making the world more livable.

The third pillar is social impact. Entrepreneurship today is distinguished not only by the pursuit of profit but also by the commitment to making the world a better place. This approach, often embodied by the concept of 'social entrepreneurship,' is particularly prevalent among young entrepreneurs. Next-generation ventures, even when for-profit, integrate social benefit into

their business models by combining commercial goals with efforts to address fundamental societal challenges; from health and education inequality to supporting disadvantaged groups and combating poverty.

The final key pillar—inclusion—is another critical dimension in the transformation of the entrepreneurial landscape. There are two aspects to this concept: Ensuring inclusive access to entrepreneurial opportunities and distributing the value created across diverse seaments of society. In the past, it was possible to define a clear entrepreneurial profile; shaped by factors such as gender, age, activity level, and social class. However, in the next-generation entrepreneurship ecosystem, this picture has completely changed. Today, women, young people, and individuals from diverse ethnic and social backgrounds have become increasingly visible in the entrepreneurial arena. Striking examples are emerging in the areas of inclusiveness and the fairer distribution

of opportunity and prosperity. Next-generation startups offer employees equity or partnership options, ensuring that the benefits of growth are shared across the team.

Women and Enterprises

When discussing the next-generation entrepreneurship ecosystem, a dedicated chapter on women is essential. One of the most remarkable aspects of the transformation in the entrepreneurship ecosystem is the global rise of women entrepreneurs. As mentioned earlier, the traditional entrepreneurial profile was predominantly male, but today, women are demonstrating much greater strength and presence. For example, at the turn of the new millennium, women entrepreneurs made up approximately thirty percent worldwide¹. Today, this rate has risen to around forty percent². We also see this upward momentum in Türkiye in the last two decades: The rate of women entrepreneurs, which was only 13 percent in 2002, has reached 17.4 percent by 2023³.

Top Examples of Rapidly Growing Entrepreneurial Ventures:

BioNTech (Germany): The company founded by Dr. Özlem Türeci and Dr. Uğur Şahin reached a global milestone by developing the first vaccine against COVID-19.

Bumble (USA): The app has reached a valuation of 14 billion dollars thanks to its unique model that empowers women in the online dating process.

BYJU'S (India): The startup, originally launched as a digital education platform, surpassed 150 million users in the post-pandemic period and emerged as a leader in the global EdTech market.

Canva (Australia) Canva, with its user-friendly interface, has reached 60 million users across more than 190 countries and achieved a valuation of 40 billion dollars

Nubank (Brasl): Latin America's largest digital bank has grown to 85 million customers and achieved a billion-dollar valuation through its commitment to financial inclusion.

SpaceX (USD): The company revolutionized space entrepreneurship by pioneering private-sector space transportation.

So what are the factors behind this rise? When examining the rise of women in the next-generation entrepreneurship ecosystem, three fundamental factors emerge: Digitalization, inclusive policies, and evolving social norms. As mentioned, digital technologies have lowered barriers to entrepreneurship, enabling women to start businesses with minimal capital and gain access to markets. While governments and institutions support

women's entrepreneurship through targeted incentives, training programs, and mentoring networks, social media and digital platforms have amplified the visibility of women entrepreneurs and created role models. thereby boosting women's confidence in entrepreneurship. Finally, increased awareness of gender equality has facilitated greater and more active participation of women in economic life, enabling them to emerge prominently as entrepreneurs.

Despite all these supportive measures, women entrepreneurs continue to face numerous challenges at various stages of their ventures. Insufficient investment support, unequal access to finance, and lack of collateral are among the primary obstacles faced. Other significant challenges include persistent gender-based prejudices, the slow evolution of women's roles

in family life, and inadequate access to training and mentorship. Despite these challenges, an increasing number of women are joining the entrepreneurship ecosystem each year, inspired and encouraged by successful peers in the field.

What will Happen in the Future?

The evolution of the entrepreneurship ecosystem will be primarily shaped by technological advancements, sustainability goals, and emerging needs. For example, advancements in artificial intelligence are expected to significantly broaden the scope of entrepreneurship. Potential areas of change include cost reductions driven by technological advancements, as well as transformations in business and entrepreneurship models.

The ongoing global crises, which are unlikely to be resolved soon, are expected to drive the entrepreneurship ecosystem toward a more impact-oriented structure. This means entrepreneurs are increasingly seen as agents who go beyond providing products or services to addressing the challenges facing our planet and society. It is unsurprising that entrepreneurship is poised to become more inclusive in the near future. Changes in the workforce are expected to reshape the current entrepreneurship model, leading to a more flexible, hybrid, and collaborative work environment. All these projections indicate that, in the near future, entrepreneurs will broaden their influence as key drivers of social transformation, equipped with technological expertise, global awareness, and a value-driven mindset.

As part of the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program, a collaboration between Alarko Holding and Habitat Association, we spoke with women entrepreneurs who received grants for their innovative business ideas and initiatives across various fields. discussing their journeys. Women entrepreneurs who share their ideas and projects with us converge around the pillars of creativity, innovation, and development.



Gizem Uysal - Helios

My work involves developing systems that utilize MOF materials—solid adsorbents to capture CO₂ from industrial flue gases. As a solution-driven entrepreneur, I blend technical knowledge with handson experience, embracing boldness and proactive leadership. The mentorship in the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program helped us refine and clarify our strategy. The training sessions were also highly beneficial in developing our business models. This enabled me to adopt a more strategic mindset and base my decisions on data.

Global warming stands as one of the most critical challenges facing us today. What innovations are you striving to achieve in carbon capture through MOF materials?

Our approach improves carbon capture by creating tailored, low-energy regenerative MOF systems for specific industries.

As a woman entrepreneur in climate technologies, what specific opportunities and challenges have you faced?

Although there have been difficulties, the emphasis on women entrepreneurs in support programs has created important opportunities.



İlknur Kayıkçı – Full Ortopedi

Our products include prostheses for amputees, orthotic devices for those who have difficulty walking or require support, along with custom insoles and orthopedic boots tailored to individual needs. We manufacture all these medical products with our 3D printer device. Considering our work, I see myself as a next-generation entrepreneur committed to innovation, adaptability, data-driven decisionmaking, and social impact through technology.

The guidance and training provided by the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program have been invaluable to my development, both professionally and personally. That said, I feel that the entrepreneurs and initiatives I connected with during the training played a significant role in my development. I used the grant from the program for the development of my business. This grant helped me to respond faster to address the gaps in my region. Thanks to this grant, I was able to replace the damaged machinery and equipment in my workplace caused by the disaster in my region, allowing me to increase my business activities. The program helped me improve my skills in creating maximum value using limited resources, correctly identifying actual needs, and delivering appropriate solutions. As a result, I became more attentive, perceptive, and oriented toward finding solutions.

What technological or methodological innovations do vou offer in areas such as gait analysis and personalized insoles?

Pressure sensors and accelerometers integrated onboard simultaneously collect comparative data. This enables us to simultaneously monitor foot-ground contact and lower limb movements, allowing for a dynamic analysis of the entire gait cycle. We automatically flag subtle differences such as pronation, supination, and asymmetries in load distribution, identifying priority areas to be referred for expert evaluation. Thanks to our rapid production options, including 5-axis CNC machining and SLS/FFF 3D printing, we are able to deliver custom-designed insoles promptly after the design process.

How has working as an entrepreneur in Hatay, a region impacted by earthquakes, shaped your perspective?

It was not just about building a business, but also a journey that gave me firsthand experience of what it means to think in a people-oriented way and create opportunities in the face of challenges. Creating more value with fewer resources, managing crises, building resilience, and embracing social responsibility and social entrepreneurship have all contributed positively.



Özge Kartal – Özge Makine

While providing contract manufacturing and machining services in the manufacturing industry, I also produce wire straightening systems and market them globally. I consider myself both a traditional and a next-generation entrepreneur. I believe that every entrepreneur, much like every leader. embodies a wide range of distinct qualities. Therefore, I cannot be confined to a single mold or title. It's like a canvas alive with a thousand vibrant hues.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program helped me the most in creating a brand identity and allowed me to make many improvements on my brand. It is so precious that I give thanks and praise for it every day. The program complemented my work through the training and grant support. I would also like to thank Alarko and Habitat for showing me that, through networking, I can connect with the entire world at the touch of a button. Participating in the program boosted my self-confidence and strengthened my inner motivation. Moreover, amid these economic

challenges, witnessing a seemingly small yet profoundly impactful collaboration has filled me with greater hope and optimism for the future

What was the biggest challenge you encountered when selling products in the Turkish and global markets, and how did you overcome it?

I was 23 years old when I began selling products in Türkiye, and establishing myself, my business, and my expertise proved to be very challenging. Since I first began in 2012, production has always been an area requiring urgent progress, where time loss was simply not an option. For a long time, I struggled to convince customers hesitant to take the risk of buying from my company. With no capital to start, I had to manage all business processes myself and learn every detail thoroughly. I overcame these challenges through years of working seven days a week, resting only to sleep, until I mastered every technical detail. The good thing was that I was able to apply everything I had learned right then and there.

In what ways does being a woman entrepreneur in the manufacturing sector give you a sense of responsibility or motivation?

I began to feel a sense of responsibility because I felt that I was representing all women. My biggest motivation was that when I first started working at a small industrial site, I saw only a handful of women. But after five years, I started seeing at least one woman in almost every production area. I took great pride in carrying the responsibility of supporting the acceptance of women in a field where they were not previously accepted.



Edanur Erçetin - Lingify

I am developing technologies to support speech and language therapies. I consider myself a visionary problem solver who transforms data from the field into solutions by combining it with technology. Drawing on my clinical experience and multidisciplinary collaborations, I focused on developing a model that addresses a genuine need.

Unlike traditional entrepreneurship, I adopt an approach that measures success not only by profitability but also by sustainable social impact. In this regard, Lingify is not just a health technology product but also a social enterprise that raises awareness and improves access in an often-overlooked area like aphasia.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program has provided us with valuable guidance, particularly in reaching our target audience and validating our market. We built a strong network throughout the program. During this process, we began to see more clearly how a solution originating in the clinical field can reach a broader audience through

the world of technology. Simultaneously, the grant allowed us to develop our prototype and collect initial user feedback. The most significant change I noticed in myself through the program was that I began to see myself not just as a product developer, but as an entrepreneur who builds vision, provides direction, and fosters collaboration. Additionally, after the program, I came to understand more concretely that value is created not only by a good idea, but also by effectively communicating the solution and delivering it to the right audience.

How did the digital solutions you developed for individuals with aphasia originate from an identified need, and what specific gap do they address?

Aphasia is a serious communication disorder that occurs after a brain injury. But unfortunately it is not recognized enough. During my volunteer work at a hospital in my undergraduate years, I encountered many individuals who were undiagnosed and lacked access to therapy. The idea for Lingify was born when one of my clients, who could initially only say 'nana,' was able to form full sentences again within 1.5 months. Our goal was not only to develop a digital application but also to raise awareness of individuals with aphasia, improve their access to therapy, and streamline the assessment and intervention processes of speech-language pathologists.

What has been the greatest advantage of developing a startup at the intersection of health and technology?

Both challenges and advantages have been integral parts of this journey. The greatest advantage was developing the solution from the ground up, grounded in firsthand observation of real needs as a healthcare professional. At the same time, technology gave us the opportunity to develop a scalable, sustainable, and time-independent therapy model.

What the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Project brings

Betül Karaca – **Factory Of Us**

I am producina sustainable products with 3D Printer. I am an entrepreneur who loves self-improvement and has strong adaptability. Today, plans A-B-C are not enough. Ventures survive when they also have plans K-L-M. Staying up to date through daily research is also a rule. You need to be resilient and navigate the economic conditions.



The support we received on sales methods during the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program and the computer we bought with the grant had a great impact. This program also helped me to make my startup more sales-oriented. Selling has become a routine for me. Design and generating benefits were very important for me, but I also understood that it is not possible to get the results you want when sales is not in the system.

What is the design process for the biocomposite furniture that you produce using 3D printers? What do you pay the most attention to in this process?

We use AI and drawing programs in our design process. We use Rhino Grasshopper, 3Dmax, any program that can be converted to STL. We use parametric design rules in this process and we can create products in

forms that cannot be produced even with a mold. Our designs demonstrate that furniture can evoke the perception of sculpture within interior spaces.

What communication strategy do you employ to raise public awareness about sustainable design and production?

We talk about facts and statistics. The future must be built on sustainable production systems, and a culture of transformation must be established. We share these rules on all platforms and try to disseminate them. Moreover, existing game-changing regulations, such as Riba and climate agreements, will require mainstream adoption on our behalf. Companies that can anticipate this will be able to adapt quickly and continue their development.



Aybüke Muratoğlu – Rainy

I elevate olive oil into a graceful life experience. The next-generation entrepreneurship is not only focused on profit, but also includes a vision based on sustainability, transparency and social impact. Traditional entrepreneurship has rules; the next generation entrepreneurship is the world of those who make their own way. I am an entrepreneur acting in this spirit. When I founded Rainy, I built it on delivering clean food directly to consumers by harmonizing technology, design, and nature, while embracing flexibility, innovation, and responsibility. Our effort to encapsulate this philosophy is a deliberate step toward making our values visible and shareable.

Thanks to the diverse courses offered in the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program, I had the opportunity to grow both personally and professionally, enhancing my skills in areas ranging from finance to design thinking. The mentoring support played a crucial role in shaping my path by helping me anticipate scenarios on uncharted paths. I was able to move forward simultaneously in production, marketing and technical support thanks to the grant I received. This has been a major catalyst for my brand's next stage of growth.

The most significant change I experienced after participating in the program was a deepened sense of self-confidence. I no longer just believe in my ideas, I take clear steps to make them a reality. Where I once thought product-oriented, I now understand that I am building a brand and focus on delivering an experience in every detail. I used to be just a producer. Now, I am an entrepreneur who communicates, leads, and inspires.

In presenting traditional olive products with a modern brand approach, where did you make the most significant differentiation?

At Rainy, we prioritize sustainability at every stage. We produce plates from olive pits, cologne from olive flowers, and soap from olive pulp, embracing a zero-waste production model that utilizes the natural byproducts of the pressing process. With our elegant gift boxes, we offer not just olive oil but the full richness of the soil's bounty, presented through a modern lens. We strive to build a brand that honors tradition while embracing the future. To share this culture with a broader audience, we embrace a sense of social responsibility through our aift boxes and sustainable products. Because for us, Rainv is not just a brand; it is part of a livable future.

What has been the most valuable lesson you've learned from combining your experience in agriculture with entrepreneurship?

The most valuable lesson learned was this: The soil favors patience, while the market rewards quick thinking. Agriculture taught me patience, hard work, and the value of cycles; entrepreneurship taught me analysis, creativity, and vision. When these two worlds converge, the decisions made can be both bold and innovative. The biggest challenge is to balance these two sides. However, the greatest power lies in this balance. It is precisely this dual perspective that defines Rainy: Both producing in the field and communicating the product's value with clarity and insight.

Elif Çatıkkaş ve Yasemin Kırkağaçlıoğlu - Kokopelli Şehirde

"Kokopelli Şehirde" is a learning and experiential space for children and adults on ecology and sustainable living. I define myself as a solution-oriented and solidarity-based entrepreneur who prioritizes social benefit. At Kokopelli Sehirde, we strive to reconnect city dwellers with nature and integrate land and production into everyday life.



The program has offered invaluable support to social impact-oriented organizations like ours, particularly as a sustainability-driven initiative. We were able to express our ideas more clearly and set our goals more strategically particularly due to the work we did in the application and presentation parts of the program. The grant funding allowed us to start using more ecofriendly practices, especially for our new bokashi compost product.

The biggest change I experienced after the program was realizing that I was not alone. Meeting entrepreneurs who share similar values, getting support and seeing opportunities for collaboration was very nurturing. I have also begun planning many things that I used to do intuitively based on data and strategy.

What is the user experience that the planting kits you offer for reconnecting with nature in urban life are aiming to create?

With our planting kits, we are aiming to offer the user an experiential space, not just a

product. We want city dwellers, especially children and working adults, to experience the entire process of planting seeds and harvesting them by hand. We want them to experience the feeling of producing something by touching the soil. At the same time, when you buy a product from Kokopelli Şehirde, join a workshop or a training, you become a part of this community and embark on a journey where you not only connect with nature, but also with each other.

What next steps do you plan to take to further expand Kokopelli Şehirde's vision of social impact?

We are pursuing three main pathways to grow our social impact: We are designing productive and relaxing green spaces that bring more employees closer to the soil through corporate collaborations. We are working with educational institutions. We are creating school gardens and teacher training programs. These programs familiarize children with nature. In collaboration with educational institutions, we are developing school gardens and teacher training programs that nurture children's connection with nature.



Esra Karakış – Mumsy Natural

With the support of experts, we combine the latest scientific advancements and the gentlest herbal ingredients in every baby formula we develop. I define myself as a people-oriented and solution-based entrepreneur. The next-generation entrepreneurship, in my opinion, has to be socially and environmentally responsible, as well as economically responsible. This journey is about producing natural products that mothers can use with peace of mind, that offer breastfeeding support to mothers, and that are really good for baby's skin.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program contributed significantly to clarify our vision and solidify our business model. I learned how to tell our brand's story more powerfully with the knowledge I gained during the training. The grant supported the revamping of our website,

making it more technologically secure, explaining our brand and mission more clearly.

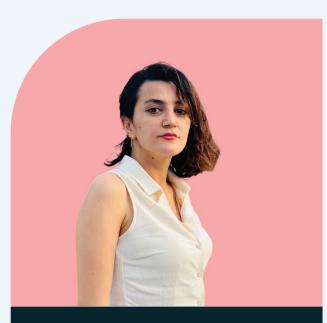
The most significant change I experienced with the program was that I started to look at my work more holistically. I used to focus only on product development, but now I also focus on the brand's values, sustainability and social impact. I also understood how precious the bond we have with mothers is.

Which gap do you fill in the sector regarding the use of clean ingredients in baby care products?

Although the industry labels baby products as "natural" or "organic," it is not always clear how reliable their ingredients are. At Mumsy Natural, we are committed to transparency of ingredients. We are using not only clean but also edible raw materials in our products. In other words, we are developing formulas with ingredients that will be harmless even if swallowed, not just when they come into contact with the skin. We are also producing our products in compliance with international GMP standards.

What needs do you observe the most in the training and seminars you conduct for mothers as part of your brand's social projects?

Mothers' desire for reliable information is the most striking need that comes to the fore in the free breastfeeding counseling. online and face-to-face sessions and seminars we offer. Mothers are looking for more than just product information; they also want expert knowledge on proper breastfeeding, ingredient literacy, baby skin health, and natural care. The mothers are also emotionally burdened. An important part of this process is providing them with a safe community where they feel they are not alone.



Nurcan Bozkurt - CIABO

I am aiming to produce natural and local products and deliver them to all corners of the world. I consider myself a "future builder" who is in tune with nature, has a strong intuition, but also relies on data and strategy. The next-generation entrepreneurship is no longer just about producing products, but about offering a philosophy of life, telling a story and creating impact. This is precisely where the CIABO brand was born. I set out to bring natural products rooted in Mesopotamia to the tables of the world with an ethical. transparent and sustainable approach. I am an entrepreneur who is committed to zero waste, who puts local producers at the center, and who combines science and nature.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program provided me not only with technical know-how, but also with courage. The training sessions helped me to focus on financial literacy, digital marketing and exporting. The mentoring support served as a compass. It helped me to

see the potential of CIABO and to carry it to the world markets with a strategic plan. I purchased an office computer to run my e-commerce operations more professionally and a pallet truck to facilitate my product transportation processes with the grant funding.

The biggest change I experienced after joining this program was in my perspective. I am now an entrepreneur who builds a brand and thinks on a global scale, not just a producer. In the past I only focused on perfecting my products. Now, I am much more aware and active in sustainable growth, effective communication, and global networking. This helped me to expand the boundaries of my own potential.

How do you audit the procurement and quality processes of local and natural products?

At CIABO, everything starts with respect for nature and people. Transparency, traceability and quality are at the heart of every step of our supply chain. We manufacture some products in-house and procure others from producers, prioritizing local sources whenever possible. We constantly monitor all laboratory processes, from chemical analysis to microbiological tests. We also keep digital records for each production batch, ensuring traceability.

What are the advantages of combining traditional production methods with modern marketing techniques?

This combination is literally the DNA of CIABO. As I mentioned, we blend the ancient wisdom of Mesopotamia with the digital power of the modern world. Presenting a handcrafted honey jar with a simple yet impactful packaging design and story—and proudly showcasing it on Instagram, Etsy, or at international fairs makes a big difference. Thus, we offer not just a product, but an experience, a value. This makes our brand unforgettable.



Seda Mahmutoğlu – Mora Dükkân

At Mora, we are committed to creating a production story that focuses on women's labor and sustainability, respecting nature, and creating social benefit with handmade and meaningful products. I define myself as an entrepreneur who prioritizes people, nature, and social benefit at the core of our production processes. My focus is not on profit, but rather on value. I am currently developing an initiative with a focus on manual labor, women's empowerment, and sustainability. In my opinion, the most beautiful aspect of next -generation entrepreneurship is that it is not just about starting a business; it also represents a way of life, a stance. My understanding of entrepreneurship is predicated on the principles of collaboration, collective production, and amplifying the social impact of our endeavors.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program gave me not only knowledge but also courage. Through training I started to think more strategically on my business model. Particularly, what I have learned about marketing, sustainability and digitalization, has carried me forward. I should say that mentorship clarified my professional direction. Receiving personalized guidance from seasoned professionals in the field has expanded my vision and clarified my objectives. Grant has helped me to make certain investments that I was dreaming of. All this not only helped me to grow my initiative but also to position it on a more substantial and impactful foundation.

The biggest change that I went through the program was an internal one. I am now much more confident in myself and what I do. It gives me great strength to see that I am now part of an ecosystem, where I felt alone at the beginning. I hear my own voice more clearly. I now know better what I want to do, who I want to walk with. I have also become a more strategic thinker and a more resilient entrepreneur. This program reminded me not only "how to do it" but also "why I do it". And this difference gave a whole new meaning to my journey.

What sort of change do you create in terms of social impact when you produce with craftswomen?

When we produce together with craftswomen, we are not merely creating a product; we are also making the invisible visible and honoring the value of labor. When women contribute their knowledge and skills to production, it strengthens their economic independence and boosts their self-confidence. Producing jointly creates a culture of solidarity. They go from feeling alone to feeling part of a community; and each of them feels empowered by that transformation. This brings both individual and social transformation. The best part is that we are building a structure together that will help make this change permanent.

What motivates you the most about producing with a circular economy approach?

What motivates me the most is that every product we produce exists in harmony with nature. Reducing waste, repurposing discarded materials, and producing in harmony with the environment is a conscientious responsibility; one that brings me a deep sense of fulfillment. At the same time, I'm fascinated to see how the circular economy reveals the potential in things once considered "worthless." This way of producing things lets us look to the present, as well as to the future. Being part of a system that benefits both people and the planet gives me a true sense of purpose.



Emine Yılmaz - Çal Women's Cooperative

We support local production and craft natural, healthy products by hand, seeing ourselves as a new generation of community-based entrepreneurs who prioritize social good. While traditional entrepreneurship typically prioritizes profit, our aim is to empower women economically, support local production, and preserve traditional knowledge for future generations.

We can say that the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program was a turning point for us. Thanks to the training, we gained knowledge in many areas from corporate structure to digital marketing. Receiving feedback from experienced people during the mentoring process helped us to see things in a different way. The grant support directly helped us increase our production capacity and enhance the professionalism of our products. It really helped up to set up our packaging, labeling, and online shopping systems.

The most significant change we observed through the Program was a boost in our self-confidence. We now know that we're more than just a local producer; we're also a social enterprise that can reach any part of Türkiye. Our planning, goalsetting and strategic thinking skills have improved significantly. We have also become more integrated into the digital world.

How did you combine the culture of collective labor with a modern entrepreneurial approach under the cooperative umbrella?

Collective labor culture is not only a production model for us, but also a way of life.

We have combined this tradition with modern entrepreneurship and developed a solidaritybased but also goal-oriented working model. In the cooperative, we value everyone's labor; we make decisions together and run the business together. We combined the things that we learned from modern entrepreneurship, such as planning, digital technology, and brand development, with the spirit of collective labor.

Please describe how you market products with a "Geographical Indication."

Products with geographical indications are both our identity and our biggest advantage. We consider these products as cultural ambassadors, not just materials to be sold. Our marketing strategy is to highlight the story behind these products. Every one of our products has a tradition, and it has a story. It has a history of its own, and a history of the people who made it. We use professional photos, short videos, and social media content to create an experience with the product. We also clearly share the geographical indication logo and information about the production process on e-commerce platforms.



Aslı Akçay – Derin Hobi ve Organizasyon

I am engaged in laser cutting, printing and organization at the same time. I am an innovative and solution-oriented entrepreneur who offers efficient and creative solutions that add value to people. My priority was to have a structure that was open to change. Through the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program, I had the opportunity to work with experienced entrepreneurs and receive support in financial, mentoring, digital, and technological areas. I feel very lucky in that sense. The training helped me to understand the dynamics of the entrepreneurial world and improve my knowledge and strategy development skills. Through networking, I made important connections in my sector and laid a stronger foundation for my business.

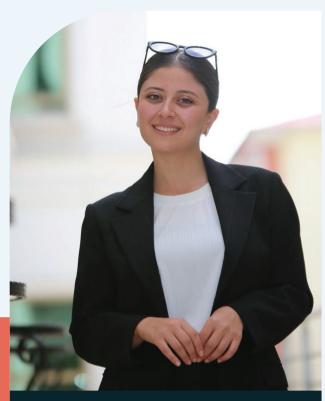
The biggest change I have experienced has been an increase in my self-confidence. Being recognized in my sector has made me more confident in my work and has encouraged me to make bold decisions that I am proud of. How did the Derin Hobi ve Organizasyon initiative contribute to social recovery after the earthquake?

We are offering affordable, fast cutting and printing services, focusing on decorative items, to shops producing personalized souvenirs and to housewives trying to earn their own income. I applied to the Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program to buy a bigger and faster model of my existing laser cutting machine to increase our production capacity and reach more people. At Derin Hobi ve Organizasyon, we will continue to work patiently, perseveringly and tenaciously to contribute to social healing.

What kind of projects are you planning to support social life in and around Hatay in the coming period?

We are planning volunteering activities such as organizing various workshops to support local and small businesses.



Rümeysa Ruken Polat - Rumii

We are a social enterprise brand that produces designer clothing, accessories and decoration items made from traditional rugs. The next-generation entrepreneurship is centered on values such as social benefit. sustainability and the generation of meaning. I define myself as an impact-oriented social entrepreneur. When I started Rumii, my goal was not only to produce esthetic products, but also to keep the traditional weaving culture alive, to make the labor of women artisans visible and to sustain local values.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program has made a significant contribution to Rumii's reorganization process. The training courses taught us more about entrepreneurship. We can do a lot more now, especially when it comes to business model development,

financial sustainability, and measuring impact. The mentoring allowed us to re-evaluate our strategic decisions and gave us a vision for new collaborations. We have taken concrete steps to improve our workshop, product development and digitalization with the grant funding. We also gained access to new networks thanks to networking support.

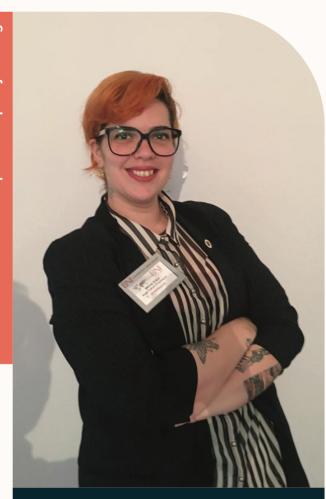
Thanks to what I learned in this program, I now spend more time on long-term goals. I'm working on growing our social impact and building a sustainable system. Before, I was more focused on day-to-day business and production. It has also been very inspiring to see that I am not alone in facing the challenges and vulnerabilities that come with entrepreneurship.

Please tell us about the new ways you have made it easier for people to see the hard work of local craftspeople and to appreciate it.

At Rumii, we make the production process easy to understand and share the story behind each product with written and visual content to show the hard work of local craftswomen. Through the training session and design workshops we organize, we empower craftswomen to engage more actively in the creative process, express themselves, and evolve from mere producers into vibrant contributors to life

What was the biggest challenge you faced in creating a sustainable economic model. and how did you manage it?

The biggest challenge in creating a sustainable economic model has been balancing the high production costs of traditional crafts with modern market demands. I invested significantly in Rumii for many years. I made significant sacrifices, not only financially but also with my time and effort. By investing for many years, we both improved our production quality and made our brand more visible.



Merve Fergökçe Erkol - Ekbeni

Ekbeni is an arable, viable, sustainable paper form! It is an innovative type of paper made from recycled materials, used by the Seeded Paper Workshop as an alternative to traditional wood-based paper, and embedded with plant seeds. We are social entrepreneurs who have transformed a globally accepted idea that has yet to take root in Türkiye into a real product. By sharing this vision with everyone we meet, we aim to create a groundbreaking new sector and raise awareness about the environment. recycling, and waste management.

Throughout the program, as I explained my product to others, I realized how systematically my initiative could be tracked and managed by following a specific formula and maintaining discipline. I came to understand how essential the details we previously overlooked are within the entrepreneurship ecosystem. We identified the steps necessary to establish a foothold in both domestic and global markets.

How do you plan to impact environmental sustainability through your plantable seed paper made from recycled waste?

By reaching out to large organizations, we are adding a new link in their waste management chain. We demonstrate how managing waste can be more creative and enjoyable than the traditional methods we are familiar with. Moreover, we can formulate this process instantly with data. At the same time, by managing waste, we contribute directly to soil and agriculture, supporting the growth of new vegetation and the overall ecosystem. The Phacelia (bee weed) seed we use in our paper comes from a remarkable plant that helps reduce pesticide use in many areas, especially in agricultural lands, while also supporting the reproduction of pollinators through high-quality nutrition.

How do your arable paper products contribute to raising environmental awareness across society? Who is your target group?

The growing use of seeded paper at both corporate and individual levels is shifting consumption patterns and demand for disposable paper products. We encourage products that are almost certain to end up as waste, such as invitations, business cards, information or thank you cards, and other short-term paper items, to be planted in soil rather than thrown away.



Esra Sen - Science And Nature Box

We are producing board games by combining science and nature in a fun way and raising students' achievement. I define myself as an "impact-driven entrepreneur with a passion for education". I believe that the next-generation entrepreneurship carries the responsibility of creating social benefit, not just economic gain.

The Pioneers of Entrepreneurship Program was a turning point for me. I learned how to strategize my business idea, analyze the target audience and create sustainability plans through the training. The mentoring was particularly effective in transforming the pedagogical and scientific aspects of my

gamification content into a more professional structure. I was also able to fast-track the production and promotion of the game Electron Hunt thanks to the grant support. This program not only advanced my idea but also revealed that a areater dream was within reach.

The biggest change I experienced with this program was in my perspective. I sharpened my skills from time management to target audience communication, from budget planning to creating brand language. Most importantly, I have learned to ask myself whether an idea can be good but also sustainable.

How do you design experiments and play kits to encourage children to love science and nature?

As with every game and experiment kit we have designed, our starting point for the Electron Hunt game was to help children learn by having fun with science. We started by recognizing that students struggled with abstract concepts such as atoms, elements and the periodic table. So we developed an engaging game in which every child can take an active role. When playing this game, students learn about the elements and at the same time try to get the electron arrangement right. They both develop strategies and internalize scientific concepts.

Which aspects of the gamification approach were most important to you when integrating it into your training content?

We designed the Electron Hunt game to increase children's curiosity and enable them to interact directly with science. We always start with a needs analysis: We take into account the curriculum level of the target age group, their interests and the connections they make with daily life. Then, we simplify the basic concepts of science and present them in a fun scenario. Material selection prioritizes recyclability and accessibility.

focused on enhancing service teams' expertise in areas such as QR code scanning, creating smart service tool accounts, installing software on the PIC6 panel, and the license acquisition process.

Alarko Carrier' Receives "Women Empowered **Board of Directors**" Award

Alarko Carrier, which continues to strengthen its egalitarian and inclusive efforts, was honored with an award in the "Companies Achieving Parity" category in the "Women Empowered Board of Directors Index."

In line with these efforts. Alarko Carrier was awarded in the category of "Companies Achieving Parity" in the "Women Empowered Board of Directors Index" at the 11th Women Directors Conference organized by the 30% Club, which aims to improve gender balance at all levels of its organization.

Çağlayan Sarayoğlu, Alarko Carrier People and Organization Director, made a statement about this important achievement: "We believe that the steps we take with our egalitarian and inclusive company policy have a transformative impact not only on our own organization but also on the sector as a whole. Accordingly, we continuously



improve our human resources policies with a focus on equal opportunity, and we remain steadfast in our efforts to support the career journeys of our female managers."





Alarko Agriculture is the First Agricultural Company in Türkiye to Sign WEPs

Alarko Agriculture Group, whose strength lies in sustainability, reinforced its leadership in this area by signing the WEPs.

Alarko Agriculture Group became the first company in the agricultural sector to sign the United Nations Women's Empowerment Principles (WEPs), in line with its commitment to responsible and sustainable agriculture and value-driven employment policies.

Developed jointly by the United Nations Global Compact and UN Women, the Women's Empowerment Principles (WEPs) aim to promote women's participation in all levels of economic life, thereby contributing to broader social welfare as a signatory of WEPs, Alarko Agriculture Group is committed to continuing its business practices related to women's empowerment. The group aims to establish collaborations in social and economic fields and carry out activities that encourage women's empowerment.

Alarko Agriculture Group is involved in every stage of the agricultural and food production value chain and aims to be among the world's top ten geothermal greenhouse producers within the next five years. It currently employs nearly a thousand people in this field. The Group will increase the number of its employees by 40 percent by the end of 2025 in line with this goal, and the ratio of female employees is currently above 70 percent. This ratio is expected to reach 85 percent as investments continue.

2024 Assessment from **MEDAŞ: Infrastructure** Strengthened by Investments and **Sustainable Success**

MEDAS, which sets an example for the entire country with its activities in its region, evaluated its 2024 initiatives.

MEDAŞ took important actions in infrastructure, technology and sustainability with an investment of TL 6.4 billion in 2024 and assessed its activities in 2024. The Company improved the reliability and continuity of its energy supply through its renewal and expansion projects, while also drawing attention to its environmentally friendly practices.

In 2024, a stronger network was created by renewing facilities that had reached the end of their useful life. The goal of uninterrupted service was reinforced by alternative lines and new connections, and energy was supplied to growing residential areas. By taking the overhead lines underground, MEDAŞ has both established a robust infrastructure and achieved an environmentally compatible appearance. The Company increased energy efficiency and implemented environmentally friendly solutions by using modern technologies in street lighting, and successfully completed planned maintenance expenditures of TL 650 million throughout 2024.

As of 2024, MEDAŞ increased the number of SCADA stations to 1700 and managed to reduce outage times from 45 minutes to 3 minutes, and had the opportunity to monitor consumption remotely and intervene quickly in outages with the Automatic Meter Reading System (OSOS). Moreover, investments including remote control of



lighting, SCADA/DMS/OMS software updates and video communication of field teams strengthened the technological infrastructure.

MEDAS attaches great importance to R&D projects and has started 48 projects to date, 17 of which are actively ongoing. The projects launched in 2024 include the Customer Information System (CIS), Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) and Workforce Management System (WFM) that support domestic technology in the energy sector. Additionally, significant progress was achieved in uninterrupted energy supply with the Live Line Maintenance Practices Project developed in line with sustainability targets.

MEDAŞ continued to cultivate future energy sector professionals through its entrepreneurship and youth support programs, while also conducting significant projects in 2024 thanks to its sustainable and environmentally friendly practices. A total of 801 luminaires, 22 medium-voltage switchgears, 51 breakers, and 122 rectifiers were recycled at the Repair, Maintenance, and Recycling Workshop, which was established this year. This resulted in significant environmental gains. MEDAŞ ranks high in national satisfaction surveys and maintained its customer-oriented approach by offering fast and effective solutions to its subscribers.

Young Talents Compete at MEDAŞ Hackathon

The MEDAS Hackathon, which was organized for the second time this year to promote innovative ideas in the energy sector and support young. aspiring entrepreneurs, concluded with a high level of participation on the Capsule Technology Platform. The event was held as part of the Energy Technologies Breakthrough Program (E.TAP), implemented under the leadership of MEDAS in cooperation with Girisim Training and Consultancy and supported by the Energy Market Regulatory Authority (EMRA) R&D Fund. Participants were trained on how to find a business idea, then developed their ideas and turned them into projects with the help of expert mentors.

The program was open to third- and fourth-year university students in the provinces of Konya, Karaman, Niăde, Aksarav, Nevsehir, and Kırsehir, It was preceded by two-day online entrepreneurship and business model canvas courses as part of the Develop Your Own Energy Workshop. Then, the projects of students who developed their business ideas through these training sessions were evaluated. In the program where 101 students applied in total. 49 students were eligible to participate in the Hackathon in 14 teams as a result

of the evaluation. Students, who received mentoring from MEDAS experts during the hackathon. developed their projects in an intensive 12-hour process.

Alarko Carrier Delivers Heat Pump Training in Adana

On Tuesday, 18 February 2025, Alarko Carrier held the "Heat Pump Installation Diagrams and Selection Program Training" for Alarko Carrier Authorized Dealers representing the Alarko brand at the Adana Office. The training delivered by Expert Trainer Özgen Çoğulu started with the opening speech of Alarko Carrier Sales Manager Mustafa Gürsoy. Following the training, which included computer applications and interactive participation from experienced authorized dealers, the participants expressed that they would feel more confident in the field.



Technological Transformation in Lighting from MEDAŞ

The remote management application of MEDAS has been expanded to cover the entire region, with all street lighting being made remotely manageable.

> MEDAŞ has initiated a new era in street lighting by remotely managing 12.244 lighting installations in the provinces of Konya, Karaman, Aksaray, Niğde, Nevsehir, and Kırsehir where it operates. This system will maximize energy efficiency by centrally controlling the lighting's on/off processes. It will eliminate problems such as early lighting or late switching off, which citizens frequently report.

> > Previously, each installation used astronomical relays to control lighting according to sunrise and sunset times. However, the use of this system caused irregularities in lighting due to relay failures over time. The remote management system allows for the instant detection and rapid intervention for any malfunctions or disruptions.

Upon completing the project, MEDAŞ General Manager Erol Uçmazbaş said: "This project is an important step in terms of energy efficiency." We started implementing remote control in 2023, and by the end of 2024, we were able to control all our installations with a centralized system. This helps us both optimize lighting times and prevent unnecessary energy consumption, and respond to citizen requests much faster."

MEPAŞ Hosts Electric Exhibition

As part of Energy Efficiency Week, MEPAŞ organized the third annual Traditional Electricity. History of Electricity, and Energy Efficiency Exhibition from 13 to 20 January. The exhibition highlighted the history of electrical energy and the importance of energy efficiency. Detailed information about the history of electricity, the first power generation plants and energy resources was given at the exhibition, which was opened by Deputy Governor Yavuz Güner. This energy journey from past to present has raised students'

awareness of reducing the environmental impact of energy consumption and promoting energy conservation. Another striking aspect of the exhibition was the nostalgic, vintage electrical devices. A collection of vintage items such as old electrical appliances, meters and measuring instruments provided visitors with a tangible demonstration of the transformation of electrical appliances from the past to the present, showing how technology has evolved over time to meet societal needs and environmental responsibilities.

These systems are versatile, with a range of models available to suit diverse requirements. Heat pumps are a highly effective solution for maintaining an ideal indoor temperature, regardless of seasonal conditions, making them a particularly environmentally friendly choice. Additionally, heat pumps are a viable solution for regions with limited access to natural energy resources. offering equal heating in living spaces."

"Alarko Flair Split reduces carbon dioxide emissions much lower with its advanced heat pump technology and powerful equipment. The Carrier Agua Comfort Series Monoblock Heat Pump offers similar features, while offering a solution that can either eliminate replace traditional gas or oil boilers or operate in combination with them. Agua Comfort can be connected to underfloor heating pipes, fan coil units, radiators and boilers, as well as to solar collectors, boilers and other heat sources. Designed for commercial and industrial applications, the Carrier AquaSnap 30RQ/RQP R32 Heat Pump offers an optimal solution as a compact system that helps reduce investment costs in full-load operations. Soon to be launched, the Carrier AquaSnap 61AQ Heat Pump series is an environmentally friendly and highly efficient system that uses a natural refrigerant."



MEDAŞ Starts the 4th Term of the Talentern Program

The 4th term of the Talentern program, which brings young prospective engineers together with the energy sector, has started. Talentern provides final-year students from electrical and electronics engineering departments at universities in Konva with the opportunity to acquire professional experience. This initiative allows students to closely understand the dynamics of the electricity distribution sector, thereby establishing a solid foundation in the field prior to graduation. Within the framework of the program, participants enhance their theoretical knowledge through practical applications by engaging in real projects under the mentorship of industry experts. Simultaneously, they acquire the competencies required by the sector through technical training. field studies, and project development processes.



A New Eco-Friendly Initiative from MEPAŞ: **Digital Invoicing**

MEPAS further enhances its commitment to environmental sustainability by implementing a digital invoice initiative.

Launched with the motto "Less Paper, More Future", the campaign aims to preserve nature and help building a sustainable future. Digital invoicing not only contributes to protecting the environment by eliminating paper waste, but also paves the way for a greener invoicing system. Users seeking to switch to digital invoices can easily apply through MEPAŞ Customer Service Centers or the call center at 444 7 786.

MEPAŞ invites its users to support protecting thousands of trees and the MEPAS Forest by securely storing their invoices digitally.



Final Steps in Kabataş-**Mahmutbey Metro Project**

The Kabatas-Mahmutbey Metro project, signed in 2015, has concluded the archaeological excavation works at Besiktas Station Section 1. These excavations, initiated in early 2016 under the oversight and administration of the Directorate of Archaeological Museums, have now reached completion. Following a workshop organized with the Municipality's Supervision Organization regarding the opening of Besiktas Station to public service, the entire station structure was transformed using advanced technology from a fully open-closed design to a partially openclosed/partially tunnel configuration. Consequently, construction could commence without the need for archaeological excavation in Section 2.

In early 2020, the Kabataş archaeological excavations, which were overseen and managed by the Directorate of Archaeological Museums. were finalized. Subsequently, the station's preliminary construction works commenced. In light of these developments, Kabataş and Beşiktaş stations are scheduled to be completed and put into public service in 2027. Upon completion of the project, Istanbul residents will be able to travel



by metro vehicles carrying 2,160 people at a time with a 90-second interval, with 19 stations and a length of 24.5 km, connecting the districts of Beyoğlu, Besiktas, Şişli, Kağıthane, Eyüpsultan, Gaziosmanpaşa, Esenler, and Bağcılar.

The Kabataş-Mahmutbey Metro line will be integrated with the Yenikapı-Hacıosman (M2), Kirazlı-Başakşehir (M3), Topkapı-Mescid-i Selam (T4), Eminönü-Alibeyköy (T5), Gayrettepe-Airport (M11), Kabataş-Bağcılar (T1), and Kabataş-Taksim (F1) rail systems. It will also connect with city ferry lines at Kabataş and Beşiktaş, IETT bus stations in Alibeyköy, Karadeniz, and Mahmutbey, and various road-based transport systems at each station. Thanks to these integrations, the line is expected to serve over 1 million passengers daily.

Uninterrupted Air Conditioning with the Right Service Maintenance

Alarko Carrier released a statement indicating how important it is to maintain the air conditioners that are used particularly in the summer months. The Company highlighted in its statement that energy savings are achieved through the professional maintenance solutions offered by Alarko Carrier for air conditioners: "Regularly maintained air



conditioners offer a number of benefits, including the potential to reduce electricity costs by decreasing energy consumption. During the maintenance of the air conditioner, the filters, indoor and outdoor units are cleaned and all parts that directly affect the performance of the device are meticulously checked. This extends the operational life of air conditioners and prevents unexpected breakdowns. Maintenance is crucial for ensuring the effectiveness of air conditioners, as neglect can lead to the accumulation of dust, dirt, and bacteria indoors, potentially compromising the quality of the air. In addition, when filters, indoor and outdoor coils are dirty, energy consumption increases. Regular professional maintenance allows air conditioners to operate healthier, more efficiently, and quieter."

"First Step to Art" Workshops with Alarko

Alarko Holding is collaborating with the Istanbul Foundation for Culture and Arts (İKSV), Türkiye's well-established cultural and arts institution, with the objective of nurturing young generations through art.

In addition to the festival workshops, special workshops will be organized throughout the year for children and teenagers of Alarko parents. At the first special event of the First Step to Art workshops for the children of Alarko employees. young members of the Alarko family aged 14 to 18 came together for a Stop-Motion Animation workshop, held on 10 May 2025, at İKSV Alt Kat, under the guidance of renowned illustrator Selin Saygılı. During the workshop, participants learned the fundamental steps of creating moving images using their own drawings.

The Hip-Hop Dance Workshop, organized in collaboration with the Istanbul Music Festival to improve children's perception of rhythm and music and to strengthen their creativity, was held on June 14-15 at Yıldız and Fenerbahçe Parks and on June 21 at İKSV Alt Kat. The Hip-Hop Dance Workshop, led by seasoned instructors Esma Akın

On July 10 and 12, children had the opportunity to develop their sense of rhythm with Ezgi Daloğlu, transform instruments into portraits with Uğur Kaya, and explore Latin jazz rhythms, bossa nova, and samba with Meltem Ege.

The "First Step to Art" project is an ongoing initiative, with activities scheduled throughout the year. Drama workshops organized by the Istanbul Theater Festival for children between the ages of 4 and 9 during the mid-term break in November 2025 will help children express themselves through different characters, build empathy and improve their collaboration skills.

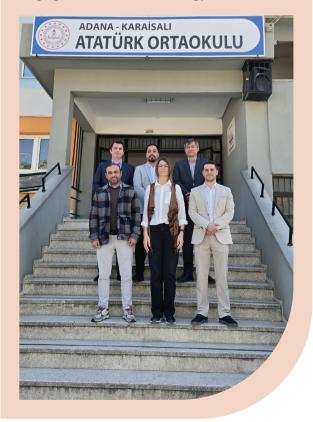
MEPAŞ and LÖSEV Work Together to Make Children's **Wishes Come True**

New Dimension in Entrepreneurship: Artificial Intelligence

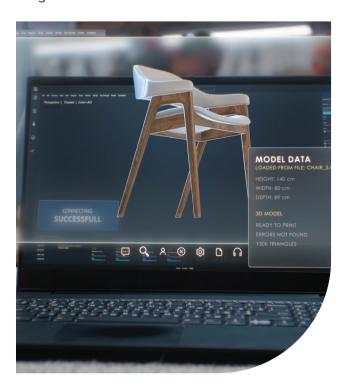
